(C) STUDENT MANAGEMENT

All students should continue to take the safe distancing measures seriously and exercise due care to protect themselves and their peers and families.

(D) STUDENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

1. CCA matters

Face-to-face CCAs will resume from Term 3 Week 3, with adherence to national safe management guidelines. eCCAs will continue to be the mode of engaging our students in their CCA experiences till then. Students will be informed separately if their CCAs are proceeding with eCCAs during T3, Week 1 and 2. All remaining National School Games (NSG) for the year will be cancelled due to the need to minimise intermingling of students from different schools.

2. After-school engagement programme

There are a variety of activities offered after school by adult volunteers to engage our students. Do encourage your child to participate.

(E) Updates on National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP)

1. The NDLP was launched in March 2020 to make digital learning inclusive by equipping students with the digital literacies to be future-ready. Through the NDLP, our Sec 1 to 3 students will own a Chromebook as a Personal Learning Device (PLD).

2. Procurement of PLDs: We have placed order for the Chromebooks and are currently waiting for the contractors to update us on the delivery date, which is around Jul or Aug.

3. Digital Literacy Courses: To prepare your child/ward better in learning with the PLD, the school will require your child/ward to complete a series of Digital Literacy Courses via SLS. These are self-paced modules and students should be able to complete each module within an hour.

4. Security of PLD: The school has installed new lockers outside the classrooms for students to keep their PLDs. Students should keep their PLDs in the lockers when they need to go for PE lessons, recess or lunch. They should bring their PLDs home at the end of the school day to charge. **Charging of the PLDs in school is not allowed.**

5. IT Applications for students: MOE will be rolling out a number of IT applications for secondary school students and these applications will be vital in supporting teaching and learning. The school will introduce these progressively when the PLD arrives. These include:

- a. Student iCON: Every secondary school student will be provided with access to the Google Suite set of tools, including email address. In doing so, we will be phasing out the use of the current school-based email address (ending with gmss.moe.edu.sg) by the end of 2021.
- b. Microsoft ProPlus: Every secondary school student will be able to use Microsoft Office tools that include Word, PowerPoint and Excel.
- c. Zoom: Every secondary school student will be given a Zoom free account with 40 min time limit for their video conferencing needs.

(F) GM's Home-Based Learning Days

In our efforts to nurture self-directed and independent learners who are passionate and intrinsically motivated, we have planned for 2 HBL days in Term 3 on Jul 19 (Mon) and Aug 26 (Thurs)). We will continue to use the class Time-Table on HBL days. All announcements, instructions (eg links to zoom sessions) and lesson materials will be assigned via SLS. Teachers may complement their mode of communication with students via whatsapp. To manage screen time for both students and teachers, synchronous lessons will be capped to half the curriculum time to keep it below 4 hours daily. To help our students maintain their daily routines, students will begin the day with a synchronous lesson for the 1st academic lesson of the day. Your child will be reminded nearer the dates.

(G) SCHOOL EVENTS

1. Racial Harmony Day

This day is commemorated on Jul 21 (Wed). Activities are planned to help students reflect on our shared experiences and values that have connected us as Singaporeans over the last 200 years. More information will be released nearer the week.

2. NRIC Registration for 15-Year old students

The NRIC registration for Singapore Citizen (SC) / Permanent Residents (PR) will be conducted in school on Jun 30 (Wed) from 1.15 - 4.15 pm. All 15-year students involved in the registration should receive notification letters from ICA. Parents will be required to log into go.gov.sg/icreg with their SingPass to submit the NRIC registration online by Jun 27 (Sun) before registration appointment in school on Jun 30. You are required to do the following during the online registration:

- Indicate child's particulars
- Upload child's photograph and supporting documents (where applicable)
- Make payment for their child's NRIC application (\$10 for SC / \$50 for PR)

3. Special Achievement Award Ceremony

This occasion will take place on Jul 23 (Fri) to affirm students who have demonstrated resilience in beating the odds to excel in curricular and co-curricular areas and are exemplary in their conduct. The time and venue of this event will be shared with the awardees closer to the date.

4. National Day Celebrations

Celebrated on Aug 6 (Fri) with an observance ceremony and meaningful activities, this year's theme focuses on how everyone in Singapore stands united to overcome challenging times together and keep Singapore safe. It is also a time to appreciate the hard work and resilience of all as we embody the Singapore spirit and are "One United People". The programme will promote how we can work together to make Singapore a better place. Students will be dismissed by 10.30am.

5. Teachers' Day Celebrations

We will celebrate Teachers' Day on Sep 2 (Thurs). Led by the Student Council, the celebrations will include performances put up by students, games and also showcases GM's Talent-time 'GEMS Got Talent'. Dismissal from school is at 10.30am.

(H) LEVEL ACTIVITIES

Sec 3 GEMS Challenge

The GEMS Challenge training sessions will continue to be on selected Thursday afternoons. Most Challenges have been completed and the rest which have been disrupted by the COVID-19 developments will continue. All activities will be done locally adhering to the latest safe management measures. Specific training dates and other details will be shared with your child by his/her teachers.

(I) Student Leadership Development

This term, we continue to build on the competencies of the various student leaders to enhance their competencies to serve the school community.

- a. Sec 2 Student Council Training - Jul 15 (Thurs)
- b. Student Council Trainees Training - Jul 29 (Thurs)
- c. Sec 3 GEMS Leaders: This training will equip them with skills in mentoring, facilitating and planning especially the 2022 Sec 1 Orientation Camp. The training dates are Jul 29 (Thurs) and Aug 5 (Thurs).

(J) VALUES-IN-ACTION (VIA)

1. Aug 30 (Mon) is designated GM's school-wide VIA Day. It will take place from 7.45am to 9:45am, followed by normal lessons for the day. The VIA programmes are aligned to Term 3's focus of 'Making a positive difference' and will imbue in our students:

- a. the ability to plan and implement ideas that will benefit others
- b. the confidence to speak, share and champion for a cause
- c. the ability to reflect on their VIA experiences and be an empathetic and caring citizen.

2. Sec 3 VIA Programme

The theme is 'Working for the Good of Society'. In Social Studies, Sec 3 students learnt about national concerns like ageing population, people with disabilities and underprivileged children. Engagement talks with various beneficiaries are planned for the students. Each class will select and partner with an agency for their VIA project. This project will continue the following year as their Sec 4 Capstone Project.

3. Time has been set aside for students to prepare and learn meaningfully. These sessions will take place on Thursday enrichment sessions between 2:45pm to 5pm on the following dates: Jul 1 VIA Launch, Jul 22 VIA preparation 1 and Aug 12 VIA preparation 2.

(L) CURRICULUM MATTERS

1. Humanities

Selected Sec 3 students have undergone training in Term 2 with NParks for the NParks Junior Guides programme via Google Meet by expert trainers from NParks. This will be followed by an onsite training activity in Botanic Gardens (subject to COVID-19 developments). Students will learn how to facilitate tours for the public in Botanic Gardens. These students will also facilitate some of the Geographical Investigation (GI) activities for the Sec 1 students in the future.

Sec 3 Core Geography students will embark on an online GI project on coastal studies where they will adopt the humanities inquiry approach to coastal fieldwork. They will learn to formulate hypotheses, apply inquiry skills and techniques to collect, analyse and present data and information. Through these GI activities, students will deepen their understanding of coastal processes and environment and share their knowledge on the challenges involved in decisions relating to mitigation and management of our fragile coastal environment. This will be carried out in term 3 or 4 depending on the Covid-19 situation.

Sec 4 Geography students will continue with the *SGFood Secure 30/30*, part of the Humanities Department Green Programme. This is a school-wide initiative to deepen understanding, encourage a mindset change, and to enhance student-led actions on food waste reduction. Students will propose solutions through their research to address food issues. This is part of the Humanities inquiry approach where students are encouraged to be curious and to explore meaningful issues like “Are we running out of food for the future?”

2. Design and Technology

Selected Sec 2 and 3 students will take part in the annual Nanyang Polytechnic Science and Technology Challenge (NYP STC) during the September holidays subject to safe distancing measures.
