Greetings from GMS(S) and welcome to Term 2!

Our school theme for 2026 is “Built to Last” and the bible verse we have chosen is Matthew 7:24. We want our students to practise empathy and consideration for others. Even simple acts such as cleaning up after eating at the canteen help to develop a sense of responsibility and demonstrate care and concern for others.

Excellence - Becoming the Best Version of Ourselves


